Answer: Ingri and Edgar Parin D'Aulaire / Maud and Miska Petersham / Berta and Elmer Hader

What was the first year the Caldecott Committee was separate from the Newbery Committee?

1980 / Ox-Cart Man

What book was awarded the Caldecott Medal by the last joint Newbery/Caldecott Committee?

The Girl Who Loved Wild Horses (1979)

Who played harmonica at the 2006 Newbery/Caldecott banquet?

Norton Juster, author of The Hello, Goodbye Window

Name any artist who has won the Medal two but not three times.

Answer: Robert McCloskey, Barbara Cooney, Nonny Hogrogian, Chris Van Allsburg, Chris Raschka

Who has provided an audio recording of the acceptance speeches for all banquet attendees since the 1960s?

Answer: Weston Woods

Who has been the only child to win a Caldecott Honor?

Answer: Plato Chan, age 13, won an honor in 1944 for *The Good Luck Horse*

What title was controversial in its time for depicting police officers as pigs?

Answer: *Sylvester and the Magic Pebble*

What title was the first Caldecott Medal winner featuring a child of color as the protagonist?

Answer: *Mei Li* by Thomas Handforth (Caldecott, 1939) won the second Caldecott Medal

British artist Anne Carroll Moore wanted to name the Medal after whom?

Answer: L. Leslie Brooke

Get the signature of someone who has served on a Caldecott Committee.

What was the only book honored by both the Newbery and Caldecott committees?

Answer: *A Visit to William Blake's Inn*

Name the A. A. Milne poem that was recited by Frederic G. Melcher at every banquet.

Answer: The King's Breakfast

What was the first year of the Caldecott Medal?

Answer: 1938

Which artist won a Caldecott Medal and Caldecott Honor in the same year?

Answer: Leonard Weisgard and Jon Klassen
